Tour Summary

This year's tour to Malaysia enjoyed great success on every front, but none more so than in its goal to find a healthy selection of the region's endemic birds and iconic mammals, recording well over a hundred of the region's endemic birds, including 29 of 51 currently recognized Bornean endemics. And for those who participated in the extension to Sarawak, a further 12 species recorded there carried the combined total to over 80% of the island's total! Of these, and the many other sightings had, highlights included a Blyth's Frogmouth attending young, Bornean Bristlehead, Diard's Whitehead's Trogon, Broadbill, Nuthatch, Whitehead's Trogon, 8 species of hornbill and White-fronted Falconet on the main tour, and Dulit Frogmouth, Bornean Frogmouth, Black Oriole and Bornean Barbet on the extension. Mammal highlights included several wonderful encounters with Bornean Orangutan, the ever-popular **Proboscis** Monkey and Greater Slow Loris. Read on for more...

Departing from our hotel in Kuala Lumpur and heading directly to our first birding spot - some wetlands just beyond the city's borders - it wasn't long before everyone in the group had seen their first lifers of the trip, species of which included Painted Stork,

Asian Openbill, Cinnamon Bittern, White-breasted Waterhen, Lesser Coucal and Blue-throated Beeeater. We then left the wetland and drove directly to the town of Kuala Selangor, where our first stop was Taman Alam. There, among the mangroves and coastal forest, we picked up a Lineated Barbet without much trouble, several Olive-winged Bulbuls, Ruby-cheeked Sunbird, Brown-throated Sunbird, Coppersmith Barbet, Mangrove Blue Flycatcher, Malaysian Pied Fantail and Common Flameback, among others. We then checked into our hotel before popping to town for a riverside lunch in the company of our first Pacific Swallows.

For the remainder of the afternoon, we returned to Taman Alam, where noteworthy sightings included more Common Flamebacks, several Laced Woodpeckers, a Little Bronze Cuckoo, Pinknecked Green Pigeons, Scaly-breasted Munias, Oriental Dollarbird, several Ashy Tailorbirds and a couple of troops of Silvery Lutung.

We set out early the next morning, in search of Large-tailed Nightjar. Trying a few spots without luck, it seemed as though we were destined to dip when suddenly one, and then another, appeared just at the eleventh hour – the sun moments from breaking the horizon. In the process, we also managed to stir up a bunch of Black-crowned Night Herons to boot. A leisurely breakfast followed, after which we packed the bus and drove to the same area where we had seen the nightjar, to make one last attempt at coaxing in a Mangrove Whistler. Rewarded we were, with great views of a singing bird, as well as a bonus Chestnut-bellied Malkoha – albeit an individual showing no

chestnut! We then departed for Fraser's Hill, making a couple of stops along the way, picking up our only Asian Pied Myna of the trip, and our first Rufous-bellied Swallows (roosting under a bridge).

Lunch at our hotel in Fraser's Hill then preceded our first walk along the Telekom Loop. At first things seemed quiet but we were soon onto a flock. One by one we picked up new birds in the flock until they had all passed on, and it was time for us to keep moving. Seeing much the same pattern of periods of quiet followed by new sightings, we eventually found ourselves back on the bus with a healthy list for our first day in the area, including Silver-eared Mesia. Mountain Fulvetta, Golden Babbler, White-throated Tailorbird, Mountain Fantail, Black-and-crimson Oriole, Black-eared Shrike-Babbler, Javan Cuckooshrike and Fire-tufted Barbet.

Early the next morning, we made our first attempt to see Mountain Scops Owl. Unfortunately, and as is almost always the case with this species in Malaysia, individuals were very vocal but not willing to show. With a little light left before breakfast time, we then headed to a feeding station of sorts, getting great views of Malaysian Laughingthrush and Short-tailed Gymnure, amongst a few other species.

After breakfast, we explored various roads around Fraser's Hill, returned for lunch at the hotel, and then made our way down to the Jeriau Falls.

This moving about throughout the day allowed us to sample a variety of elevations within the area, and a list of great birds as a consequence. Our final bird of the day, for example, was Malaysian Eared Nightjar (not far from the waterfalls), whilst the rest of the day's sightings included Black-throated Sunbird, Long-billed Spiderhunter, Orange-bellied Flowerpecker, Orange-bellied Leafbird, Verditer Flycatcher, Silver-breasted Broadbill, Hill Blue Flycacther, Black Laughingthrush, Mountain Bulbul, Scaly-breasted Bulbul, Common Green Magpie, Banded Kingfisher, Rhinoceros Hornbill and two Siamang!

Our second morning in Fraser's Hill started the same way the previous one did, whilst the remainder of the day saw us visiting a few familiar areas and couple of new ones. Of the latter, the Hemmant Trail was the most rewarding, providing us with our first great looks at Rufous-browed Flycatcher and Large Niltava, Mountain Leaf Warbler, Grey-throated Babbler, Buff-breasted Babbler and Lesser Shortwing. Our second visit to the Telekom Loop, however, gave us a greatest selection of our most-desired birds. Chief among these was Long-tailed Boradbill (a sizable flock), Sultan Tit and Blue Nuthatch (several!). Other significant sightings during the day included good views of Mountain Imperial Pigeon, Common Green Magpie, Blyth's Shrike-Babbler and Chestnut-crowned Warbler (all near the non-partridge site).

For our final morning in the Fraser's Hill area we made our way to the bottom of the hill, where several fruiting trees made for some of the most enjoyable birding of the trip. Among the slough of species sighted during our couple of hours there, several species of barbet (Blue-eared, Red-



throated, Golden-whiskered and Black-browed), Bar-winged Flycatcher-shrike, Dark-necked Tailorbird, Chestnut-breasted Malkoha and an Orange-breasted Trogon. After that magical birding session, we drove to Taman Negara for our next adventure.

Arriving to see the lush tropical forests surrounding the Taman Negara Resort always elicits a sense of excitement at what birds might lie ahead, but what greeted us upon arrival was a whole lot more exciting - a Blyth's Frogmouth and its half-grown chick, sitting right above the steps up to the resort! What treat, and a sight we were able to enjoy at our leisure, not just for the first few moments, but for two days afterwards! With that excitement, however, we were really beginning to feel the humidity for which the park is so famous. We therefore decided to take a short break and to convene in the lodge grounds for a spot of introductory lowland birding.

More luck was on our side, we discovered as we gathered around near our rooms, as a fruiting tree right there was pulling in all manner of avian treats. Among the bounty were countless Thick-billed Green Pigeons, Asian Fairy-bluebirds, a Crimson-breasted Flowerpecker, several bulbul species (including Grey-bellied), Blue-crowned Hanging Parrots and our first Sooty Barbets.

Over the following three days, we would visit that fruiting tree on several occasions, finding new birds on most of our visits. For the remainder of our time, we alternated between long, morning walks into the forest, strolls to the

open areas around the campsite, scanning sessions from hides, and nocturnal forays for owls and frogmouths.

Included in the former, walks along the Muda, Blau and Swamp trails provided us with the majority of our great sightings during our time in the park. Of these, highlights included a pair of cracking Diard's Trogons, Scarlet-rumped Trogons, Green Broadbill, glimpses of Giant Pitta, Bluebanded Kingfisher, White-crowned Hornbill, Great Slaty Woodpecker, numerous bulbul species, Black-throated Babbler, Chestnut-rumped Babbler, Large Wren Babbler (through the scope!), Bluerumped Parrot (perched!) and a lovely male Rufous-chested Flycatcher.

Our nocturnal forays were a little more frustrating but we did manage unbeatable views of Sunda Scops Owl – after much effort, that is – whilst sessions in open areas around camp and the river secured us views of both Banded and Buff-necked Woodpeckers, Plaintive Cuckoo, Squaretailed Drongo-Cuckoos, Purple-gaped Sunbird and, of course, the stars of camp, a group of Crested Fireback. Regular stops at the Taman Hide also ensured several great views of Black-thighed Falconet. All in all, a very successful time in the park!

Before departing Taman Negara, we did one final stroll around camp but turned up nothing of particular interest, so we departed for Kuala Lumpur and our flight to Kota Kinabalu in good time, stopping briefly after departure for a magnificent Changeable Hawk-Eagle by the side of the road.



Needless to say, not much else of interest was sighted during the remainder of the day.

With a few hours to spare before our flight to Lahad Datu, we paid a visit to a few spots around Kota Kinabalu. The first of these stops - pretty close to the centre of town produced great views of Nankeen Night Heron, whilst our second was at the much greener surrounding of Prince Philip Park. While there, we had great views of nesting Blue-naped Parrots, confiding Oriental Pied Hornbills, a very active Sunda Pygmy Woodpecker, Zebra Dove, White-breasted Woodswallows and our first Bornean endemic, Dusky Munia. Our third stop was a little bonus for wrapping up the birds at Prince Philip Park so rapidly. Nobody complained though, as we rapidly picked up the target, Malaysian Plover, along with a few other terns and waders to pad the list with.

Our flight to Lahad Datu went without glitch and we soon found ourselves on the road to the Danum Valley and the highly acclaimed Borneo Rainforest Lodge. Along the way we spotted our first Whiskered Treeswifts and a Yellow-throated Marten, whist our timely arrival left us with enough time to start exploring the rich surroundings of camp. What a pleasure it was, as on a short walk from the rooms to the staff compound and back, we found no less than a handful of star new birds for the trip, including Wallace's Hawk Eagle, Oriental Dwarf

Kingfisher, Brown Fulvetta, the endemic race of Crested Fireback, and Bornean Spiderhunter. After dinner, we took part in our first nocturnal drive, bagging great views of Brown Wood Owl and two species of flying squirrel.

Over the following two and a half days, exploration further beyond camp ensured yet more great species of bird and mammal trickled their way onto our list, even if obtaining good views was a little frustrating at times. Our most significant sighting was, of course, that of the island's monotypic family, Bristlehead, which we had great views of! Raffle's Malkoha, Buffy Fish Owl, Grey-rumped Treeswift, Helmeted Hornbill, Yellow-crowned Barbet, Rufous Piculet, Grey-and-buff Woodpecker, Finsch's Bulbul, Rufous-tailed Tailorbird, Bold-striped Tit-Babbler, Short-tailed Babbler, Rufous-tailed Shama, Van Hasselt's Sunbird, Little Spiderhunter, Plain Sunbird, White-crowned Forktail and Bornean Spiderhunter also put in stellar appearances, though it was the mammals that stole the show on many occasions. Naturally, the undoubted top of the pick of these was Bornean Orangutan, of which we saw several, including exceptionally close females with young, and males. Muller's Bornean Gibbon and Red Leaf Monkey completed the trio of diurnal primates to draw our gaze, whilst a Greater Slow Loris and a couple of Colugos had to compete with Leopard Cat for prize animal-of-the-night! Great meals also vied for our attention throughout our stay and we were very reluctant to leave the great surroundings but had much more in store, as well as a score to settle with one of our final targets for the area.

It wasn't, however, until we were almost entirely out of the Danum Valley on our final day there when White-fronted Falconets were spotted! On the upside, we had fantastic views and plenty of time to admire these great little birds, before making our way to Lahad Datu for lunch and a change of vehicles.

Our first destination after lunch was Gomantong Cave, where a little birding along the access road turned up a gorgeous Red-naped Trogon, a Violet Cuckoo, Cream-vented Bulbul and several striking Black-and-red Broadbills. Near the cave itself, we had great views of a couple of Bat Hawks, yet another Orangutan, our second Little Spiderhunter and a hunting Rufous-bellied Hawk-Eagle, whilst a short tour of the interior of the cave gave us insight into the lives of the millions of swiftlets that call the cave their home – four species in all!

Later that afternoon, we continued to the Kinabatangan River.

The Kinabatangan River remains one of the greatest places to see a variety of Borneo's top birds, in addition to offering a very enjoyable and relaxing way to get around the otherwise hot and sticky lowlands. Taking to her waters for several hours, both morning and afternoon, we took full advantage of the opportunity to relax and pick up a host of new birds. The

principle target for the area, Storm's Stork, didn't take much time to find, and it was with a sense of relief for the species' status that we found several individuals during our stay. Other great sightings included our only Lesser Adjutant of the trip, a handful of Jerdon's Baza, White-bellied Sea Eagle, Lesser Fish Eagle, demonstrative Stork-billed Kingfishers, Bushy-crested and Wrinkled Hornbills, a family of Brown Barbets, Long-tailed Parakeets, and Dusky Broadbill. An early evening return from our final boat trip of the day also gave us great views of a Buffy Fish Owl.

But let's not forget that most special of primates that also draws so many a nature-lover to the Kinabatangan's shores – Proboscis Monkey (a.k.a. the Jimmy Durante Monkey). We saw several groups of these bizarre and oddly charismatic creatures, even watching the acrobatics of their slightly better-looking young on several occasions.

One last cruise along the Kinabatangan added Fiery Minivet and Oriental Darter to our trip list, whilst the drive to Sandakan gave us Long-tailed Shrike and Striated Grassbird. And with that, the lowland leg of our Borneo explorations came to an end, ahead lay a short hop back to Kota Kinabalu and a drive to Mt Kinabalu.

Eager to begin our explorations of the cool highlands, and to see some of the many endemics they harbour, we devoured a very early breakfast the next morning, allowing us to be positioned in the park well before sunrise. This proved very productive for several species, and it was without hesitation that we repeated the action on all subsequent visits. We also opted for lunches in the park, placing us in the forest for three long and eventually productive days. Admittedly, there were long



periods of disturbing quiet within the forest but perseverance paid off, especially for certain species!

Walking along some of the park's many trails, and along the main road on several occasions, we had little trouble finding Bornean Whistling Thrush in the early hours of the morning, nor did we struggle to find noisy flocking Chestnut-crested Yuhinas, Bornean Whistlers, Black-capped White-eyes, Chestnut-hooded Laughingthrushes and Eyebrowed Jungle Flycatcher. Surprisingly, Whitehead's Broadbill also put in several candid appearances! Other species that weren't so commonly encountered but required no work included Crismon-headed Partridge (a male which simply walked into the road in front of us!), Golden-naped Barbet, Checker-throated Woodpecker, Yellow-breasted Warbler, Sunda Cuckooshrike, Bornean Treepie, Indigo Flycatcher, Mountain Blackeye, Orange-headed Thrush, Snowy-browed Flycatcher, Bornean Green Magpie, Sunda Bush Warbler, Black-sided Flowerpecker and Temminck's Sunbird. Sunda Laughingthrush and Redbreasted Partridge put in brief appearances, while Bare-headed Laughingthrush showed up on two occasions and stuck around long enough for good views at least.

The three birds that gave us a real run-around in the end were Everett's Thrush, Bornean Forktail and that master of the disappearing act, Whitehead's Trogon. The former required a lot of careful scanning by the roadsides in early hours of the morning, only when it was finally spotted, it stuck around only long enough for a few of us to see it. Bornean Forktail was actually glimpsed and heard on several occasions but it took a concerted effort (and a little herding) before one finally perched in full view. Whitehead's Trogon, by contrast, was not even glimpsed for almost our entire time on the mountain, despite countless hours searching. Then, just as an unfortunate incident depleted our numbers, a pair made an almost magically sudden appearance, only to spend several moments sitting motionless! Bitter-sweet indeed, and nothing short of an eleventh hour find, but a fantastic bird with which to end the tour nonetheless.

Fantastic views on Mt Kinabalu.

(H) Red Junglefowl Gallus gallus

Heard around Kuala Selangor.

Crested Fireback (RE) Lophura ignita

Great views at Taman Negara and in the Danum Valley.

(H) Malayan Peacock-Pheasant (RE) Polyplectron malacense

Heard at Taman Negara.

Heard at Taman Negara and in the Danum Valley.

Storm's Stork (RE) Ciconia stormi

Several seen well along the Kinabatangan River.

Asian Openbill Anastomus oscitans

One sighting, just outside Kuala Lumpur.

Painted Stork Mycteria leucocephala

Also sighted only once, at the same site as the above species.

Lesser Adjutant Leptoptilos javanicus

A handful, along the Kinabatangan River.

Bitterns and Herons Ardeidae

Cinnamon Bittern Ixobrychus sinensis

Two individuals, at a wetland near Kuala Lumpur.

Black-crowned Night-Heron Nycticorax nycticorax

Kuala Selangor and Kota Kinabalu.

Nankeen Night-Heron Nycticorax caledonicus

Several in Kota Kinabalu, one in Lahad Datu.

Striated Heron Butorides striata

First sighted around Kuala Selangor.

Eastern Cattle Egret Bubulcus coromandus

Kuala Selangor and Lahad Datu.

Grey Heron Ardea cinerea

Sighted near Kuala Lumpur and Kuala Selangor only.

Purple Heron Ardea purpurea

Kuala Lumpur, Kuala Selangor and the Kinabatangan River.

Great Egret Ardea alba

Sighted on the first day, and again along the Kinabatangan River.

Intermediate Egret Egretta intermedia

Kota Kinabalu and Lahad Datu.

Little Egret Egretta garzetta

First sighted between Kuala Lumpur and Kuala Selangor.

Pacific Reef Egret Egretta sacra

Kota Kinabalu.

Anhingas Anhingidae

Oriental Darter Anhinga melanogaster

Sighted at the Kinabatangan River only.

Kites, Hawks & Eagles Accipitridae

Jerdon's Baza Aviceda jerdoni

Great views, along the Kinabatangan River.

Crested Serpent Eagle Spilornis cheela

Several sightings, following our first at Kuala Selangor.

Bat Hawk Macheiramphus alcinus

Fantastic views at the Gomantong Caves.

Changeable Hawk-Eagle Nisaetus cirrhatus

First sighted soon after departure from Taman Negara.

One sighting at Fraser's Hill.

Wallace's Hawk-Eagle (RE) Nisaetus nanus

Fantastic views of a pair at BRL.

Rufous-bellied Hawk-Eagle Lophotriorchis kienerii

One seen hunting bats at the Gomantong Caves.

Black Eagle Ictinaetus malayensis

Fraser's Hill and the Danum Valley.

Crested Goshawk Accipiter trivirgatus

Sighted only along the Kinabatangan River.

Brahminy Kite Haliastur indus

A few sightings, around Kuala Selangor and the Kinabatangan River.

White-bellied Sea Eagle Haliaeetus leucogaster

First sighted at Taman Negara.

Lesser Fish-Eagle Haliaeetus humilis

Great views along the Kinabatangan River.

Rails, Crakes & Coots Rallidae

White-breasted Waterhen Amaurornis phoenicurus

One of the first species sighted on the trip.

Plovers Charadriidae

Red-wattled Lapwing Vanellus indicus

A few sighted between Kuala Lumpur and Kuala Selengor.

Malaysian Plover Charadrius peronii

A nice bonus 'grabbed' just before our flight to Lahad Datu.

Gulls, Terns and Skimmers Laridae

Whiskered Tern Chlidonias hybrida

Kota Kinabalu.

Common Tern Sterna Longipennis

Kota Kinabalu.

Little Tern Sterna albifrons

Kota Kinabalu.

Spotted Dove *Spilopelia chinensis*

First sighted on the outskirts of Kuala Lumpur.

Common Emerald Dove Chalcophaps indica

Taman Negara and the Danum Valley.

Zebra Dove (RE) Geopelia striata

Kuala Selangor and Kota Kinabalu.

Pink-necked Green-Pigeon Treron vernans

Common at Kuala Selangor.

Orange-breasted Green-Pigeon Treron bicinctus

One sighting, at Taman Negara.

Daily sightings at the fruiting tree at Taman Negara.

Green Imperial-Pigeon Ducula aenea

Common in Kota Kinabalu and along the Kinabatangan River.

Mountain Imperial-Pigeon Ducula badia

Great views around Fraser's Hill.

Cuckoos Cuculidae

Greater Coucal Centropus sinensis

First sighted at Taman Negara.

Lesser Coucal Centropus bengalensis

Great looks, at a wetland on the outskirts of Kuala Lumpur.

(H) Bornean Ground Cuckoo (BE) Rhinortha chlorophaeus Heard at BRL.

Raffles' Malkoha (RE) Rhinortha chlorophaeus

Great views, along the BRL access road.

Chestnut-breasted Malkoha (RE) *Phaenicophaeus curvirostris* Several sightings.

Chestnut-bellied Malkoha (RE) Phaenicophaeus sumatranus

One sighting, at Kuala Selangor.

Black-bellied Malkoha (RE) Phaenicophaeus diardi

Also sighted only once, at Taman Negara.

Green-billed Malkoha Phaenicophaeus tristis

One sighting near Kuala Selangor.

Asian Koel Eudynamys scolopacea

One pair, in the grounds of our hotel in Kuala Selangor.

Violet Cuckoo Chrysococcyx xanthorhynchus

Several heard, one sighted near the Gomantong Caves.

Little Bronze Cuckoo Chyrsococcycx minutillus

A single bird scoped at Kuala Selangor.

Banded Bay Cuckoo Cacomantis sonneratii

Great views, at both Fraser's Hill and Taman Negara.

Plaintive Cuckoo Cacomantis merulinus

Also seen very well at Taman Negara.

(H) Rusty-breasted Cuckoo Cacomantis sepulcralis

Heard on a few occasions, on the peninsula.

Square-tailed Drongo-Cuckoo Surniculus lugubris

Great views at Taman Negara.

(H) Moustached Hawk-Cuckoo Surniculus lugubris

Heard near Gomantong Cave.

Indian Cuckoo Cuculus micropterus

One sighting from the hide at Taman Negara.

Owls Strigidae

(H) Mountain Scops Owl Otus spilocephalus

Heard throughout Fraser's Hill.

Sunda Scops Owl (RE) Otus spilocephalus

Great views at Taman Negara (eventually!).

Buffy Fish-Owl Ketupa ketupu

Unbeatable views in the Danum Valley and along the Kinabatangan.

Eone, during a night drive in the Danum Valley.

(H) Collared Owlet Glaucidium brodiei

Heard at Fraser's Hill.

Frogmouths Podargidae

(H) Gould's Frogmouth (RE) Batrochostomus stellatus

Blyth's Frogmouth Batrochostomus affinis

Being able to watch both adult and young of this species, on the nest, and at our leisure, was one of the highlights of the trip.

Nightjars Caprimulgae

Malaysian Eared Nightjar (RE) Lyncornis temminckii

Good looks, at Fraser's Hill.

Large-tailed Nightjar Caprimulgus macrurus

Found at the eleventh hour at Kuala Selangor.

Treeswifts Hemiprocnidae

Grey-rumped Treeswift Hemiprocne longipennis

Good views, in the Danum Valley.

Whiskered Treeswift Hemiprocne longipennis

Great looks, also in the Danum Valley.

Swifts Apodidae

Glossy Swiftlet Collocalia esculenta

Several sightings, throughout the trip.

Bornean Swiftlet (BE) Collocalia dodgei

One sighting, on Mt Kinabalu.

Mossy-nest Swiftlet Aerodramus salangana

Gomantong Cave.

Black-nest Swiftlet (RE) Aerodramus maximus

Gomantong Cave.

Edible-nest Swiftlet Aerodramus fuciphagus

Kuala Selangor and Gomantong Cave.

Silver-rumped Spinetail (RE) Rhaphidura leucopygialis

Especially good views around BRL.

House Swift Apus nipalensis

Several sightings during the first four days of the trip.

Trogons Trogonidae
