Tour in Detail

We all met up in the colonial city of San Cristobal de las Casas. Those arriving from the Oaxaca leg of the tour were able to see a Cinnamon-tailed Sparrow en route. We had dinner and shortly after Jim arrived and we set off for some owling in the pine-oak forests above town. We got out on a very pleasant evening under a nearly full moon and starlit sky. It took little time to find a Bearded Screech Owl, an attractive high-altitude owl with a tiny range that made for an exciting start to our tour. As we eventually left the owl to its night, we barely had time to celebrate our success when something even better, an Unspotted Saw-whet Owl, started calling very nearby. After a few minutes search it was finally located and most people were able to get a reasonable view of it high up in a pine. However, not everyone was able to see it before it flew so we then worked hard to relocate it and eventually did, way up high, where we could even view it in the scope. WOW! Two phenomenal owls in short order – what a night!

It was a slightly shorter night sleep after last night's owling escapades, but we headed back into the pine-oak forests

early in the morning. The whole area was really dry (as would be all areas due to drought) and bird activity was fairly subdued, but we worked hard for the birds and achieved some great results. Our most wanted bird here, Pink-headed Warbler, could not have showed better! Other good finds through the morning included Garnet-throated Hummingbird, Amethyst-throated Mountaingem, Unicolored Jays, Rufous-collared Thrush, and Yellow-backed Oriole. We were also able to have a close study of the very range restricted Chiapan Stripeless Snake. Returning to town we were fortunate to locate a couple breeding pairs of Black-capped Swallow nesting alongside a busy street and giving excellent views. After a leisurely lunch we drove on through to the small city of Comitan.

The next morning was spent wandering the oak forests in the vicinity of the Mayan ruins of Tenam Puente, a very enjoyable and productive morning was had. The spectacular Belted Flycatcher was cooperative for us and showed nicely and Slender Sheartail fed in roadside flowers giving us fantastic views! Other highlights of the morning were three different Lesser Roadrunners, Prevost's Ground Sparrow, spectacular Yellow Grosbeaks

and skulking Blue-and-white Mockingbird and there was plenty to look at all morning long. The afternoon was spent retracing our steps back to Tuxtla Gutierrez, a rather long drive, where we ended the day at a traditional Chiapan restaurant.

Next up we visited a new site for this itinerary, Tapalapa Road. It required an early start and a long drive, but it was worth it to spend the better part of the day exploring some beautiful cloud forest. Birding was excellent through the morning with multiple parties of Black-throated Jay and a single Azure-hooded Jay, Blue-throated Motmot, Emerald Toucanets, fantastic views of Green-throated Mountaingem and Bluecrowned Chlorophonia along with White-naped Brushfinch, Mountain Trogon and a bonus Mexican Whip-poor-will in broad daylight. The

calls of Brown-backed Solitaire rang through the forest all day and a variety of migrant warblers were present including several Blackburnian and even a Canada Warbler on passage. The afternoon was much quieter, but we did find a really cool Abronia, Morelet's Alligator Lizard before undertaking the drive back to Tuxtla.

We now had a full day at the magnificent Sumidero Canyon. In addition to glorious views of this famous canyon at various points the birding here is excellent in this dry forest. We found both both of our most hoped for species in the form of a scoped-up Bar-winged Oriole and a Cabanis' Seedeater performing well in its dense bamboo habitat. A huge bonus was a small covey of Singing Quail that gave nice views as they crept along through the leaf litter. Other tops birds for the day included Flammulated Flycatcher and Belted Flycatcher, Banded and Cabanis' Wren and Blue-and-white Mockingbird. By early afternoon the heat had become intense, so we retreated to the comfort of our hotel where the grounds had Green Parakeet and White-fronted Amazon.

The next morning saw us at El Ocote, a fantastic forest that has some of the highest avian diversity anywhere in Mexico and significant Caribbean slope influence on the species list. The first hour and a half of birding was

excellent with fantastic bird activity and highlights such Crimson-collared as Tanager, Curve-winged Sabrewing and White-bellied Wren. But then the cicadas took over and things got very quiet. We had to work really hard to even hear a Nava's Wren and then it took a very patient wait, but all worth it when an inquisitive bird popped out right in front of us giving We continued us exceptional views! birding until the early part of the afternoon adding Green Shrike Vireo, Black-faced Grosbeak, migrating Broad-winged and Swainson's Hawks and even a brief appearance by a male Cerulean Warbler, something of a rarity in Chiapas. Continuing onwards, we had some time in the latter part of the afternoon to bird the arid Pacific slope forest at La Sepultura. We managed to connect with some

exceptional Rosita's Buntings along with a female and immature male Long-tailed Manakin during our birding here before finishing up the day at Arriaga.

Returning to La Sepultura the following morning we had to deal with windy conditions. We found a couple of

Green-fronted Hummingbirds early on although had to return later in the morning to get better looks at this attractive and scarce hummer. We also saw Rosita's and Orange-breasted Bunting, Stripeheaded Sparrow, and a few other things but it was generally quiet birding. There was a fair bit of visible migration going on with flocks of Western Kingbird, Scissor-tailed Flycatcher, Cliff and Barn Swallow and Swainson's Hawk moving throughout the morning. We then drove south to the small city of Mapastapec. A late afternoon walk around town revealed Velasquez's Woodpecker, Orange-chinned Parakeet and lots of migrating raptors and swallows. After dinner we tried some owling and found a pair of Pacific Screech Owls perched side by side on a branch, their bodies quivering as they sang their duets. A fantastic sight.

Leaving Mapastapec early the following morning we slowly birded our way through the remnant dry forests and pastures on the way towards the Pacific coast. We soon enjoyed our first of numerous Giant Wren, a common but very localized wren and quite spectacular. Continuing onwards, we had good views of Turquoise-browed Motmot, White-bellied

Chachalaca and Yellow-naped Amazon along with heavy bird activity and even some scarce Mexican species like Double-striped Thick-knee and Southern Lapwing. Eventually reaching to the mangroves we set about for a very pleasant and productive cruise through the mangroves Agami Herons put on a memorable show with impressive numbers of this beautiful heron present here. Sungrebes were also cooperative and amongst numerous other highlights were Gray-headed Kite and four species of kingfisher, Pygmy Kingfisher showing particularly well. Freshly caught Red Snapper was on the menu before we continued along our way south almost to the Guatemalan border and then up onto the lower slopes of Tacana volcano. Just above the village of Union Juarez we birded a patch of mid elevation cloud forest for the remainder of the day and although it was rather quiet, we did have good numbers of Pacific Parakeets, a soaring, White-breasted Hawk, and a typically furtive Ruddy Foliage-gleaner that showed pretty good in the end. Back in town we had a very nice dinner.

For our final day of the tour, we drove over to the little village of Benito Juarez and walked around the outskirts of town along with a couple of locals guides. The early morning hours were fantastic as we had perfect light and unparalleled views of a pair of Azure-rumped Tanager! A flowering tree was being constantly attended by

several Emerald-chinned Hummingbirds and all the intricate details of their colourful plumage could be well observed. Green-throated Mountaingem was also visiting the tree and then a Black-crested Coquette caused a bit of a surprise when it appeared and showed very well for a couple minutes! Not quite as flashy but also showing nicely was Guatemalan Tyrannulet. At Nelson's house the garden was buzzing with hummingbird activity from three species: Rufous and Violet Sabrewings plus Blue-tailed Hummingbird. A Black Hawk-Eagle also called as it flew high overhead. We had a tasty lunch there as well and birding was generally quiet in the heat of the day, but our persistence was rewarded with a great sighting of Hooded Grosbeak. That was quite an appropriate send-off as for those who had been on the nearly month-long series of tours, that was our first bird on our first morning and now basically our last bird of the trip. All that was left to do now was drive down to Tapachula and have one final meal together.
