Tour Summary

Kenya and Tanzania are regarded by many as two of the world's premier wildlife destinations. Game viewing is often done at close quarters and fantastic birding opportunities are available around every corner. The wonderful wildlife is coupled with some of the most majestic vistas to provide experiences

that the rest of the world would struggle to match. As a result, these countries are often placed highly on many an individual's dream destination list. Our tour through this East African safari circuit did not disappoint.

The tour began with a relaxed arrival day in Arusha, where we had time to explore some vast gardens at leisure. The gardens included a mix of riverine woodland and freshwater habitats, which hosted a fantastic array of species. Common garden species included Augur Buzzard and African Emerald Cuckoo, which we were fortunate to get good views of.

Once the entire tour group had assembled, we sat for a welcome dinner before enjoying our first tour activity: a walk around the lodge compound. This produced African Wood Owl and Wahlberg's Epauletted Fruit Bat before we returned to our rooms for our first relaxing night ahead of a busy tour.

We woke up the next morning to heavy rainfall which had set in overnight. Undeterred, we tried to locate as many species in the gardens as possible. Although the pickings where slim, we still managed to add Egyptian Goose, Little Grebe, Hadada Ibis, African Palm Swift, Black-throated Wattle-eye, African Pied Wagtail, Dark-capped Bulbul, and Thick-billed and Taveta Weavers. We also enjoyed the acrobatics of a troop of Blue Monkey before we settled in for a wonderful breakfast and met our local guide, Moses, who would join us throughout our exploration of Tanzania. With the rain still falling, we departed Arusha and made our way

west towards our destination, Tarangire National Park. As we progressed, the weather cleared up a little because of our descent in elevation, which allowed us to locate some incredible bird species en route: Western Cattle Egret, Black-headed Heron, Augur Buzzard, Spur-winged Lapwing, Little Swift, Pied Crow, Fischer's Sparrow-Lark, Rufous-naped Lark, Brown-throated Martin, Variable Sunbird, House and Kenya Sparrows, Baglafecht Weaver, Red-billed Quelea, Southern Red Bishop, and Barn and Wire-tailed Swallows. Thankfully, when we arrived at Tarangire National Park the sun was shining. The bird activity was fantastic, and we managed to add two of our main target species: Ashy Starling and Yellow-collared Lovebird; while also managing to add a few of the more common species, including Speckled Pigeon, Ring-necked Dove, Diederik and Red-chested Cuckoos, Lappet-faced Vulture, Bateleur, Von der Decken's Hornbill, Northern Red-billed Hornbill, Northern White-crowned

Shrike, African Hoopoe, Eastern Grey and Nubian Woodpeckers, Fork-tailed Drongo, Grey Penduline Tit, Tawny-flanked Prinia, African Grey Flycatcher, Grey-headed Kingfisher, Spotted Palm Thrush, Northern Grey-headed Sparrow, Red-cheeked Cordon-bleu, abundant Superb Starling and Mottled Spinetail near a large Baobab tree before lunch.

Sated by a delicious lunch, we made our way into the National Park where we began to encounter our first mammals of the tour, including Olive Baboon, Common Dwarf Mongoose, Plains Zebra, Impala, Common Wildebeest, Waterbuck, Grant's Gazelle, African Buffalo and Giraffe (known as the Masai Giraffe of subspecies tippelskirchii). We also added a few new bird species as we progressed through the savannah grasslands and the interspersed Baobab trees. We were privileged to connect with Common Ostrich, Red-necked Spurfowl, White-backed Vulture, Eastern Chanting Goshawk, Pearlspotted Owlet, Speckled Mousebird, Little Bee-

eater, Red-bellied Parrot, Lilac-breasted Roller, Magpie Shrike, Long-tailed Fiscal, White-bellied Go-away-bird, Flappet Lark, Lesser Striped Swallow, Yellow-billed Oxpecker, Silverbird, Rufous-tailed Weaver, and Red-billed and White-headed Buffalo Weavers. The gathering storm clouds put an abrupt halt to any further birding activity as everything hid away from the impending downpour; although a pair of African Hawk-Eagle was seen attempting to hunt Helmeted Guineafowl during the storm. Not long afterwards, we arrived at our well-appointed guest lodge, where we settled for the evening before a fantastic dinner and a surprise bird species, Freckled Nightjar, sitting on the roof. Happy with an incredible start to our tour, we settled into our comfortable rooms for a good night's sleep.

Our first full day in Tarangire started with a visit to a local wetland, where we began looking for and finding various waterbirds, including Fulvous Whistling Duck, Spur-winged Goose, Knob-billed Duck, African Openbill, Squacco Heron, Hamerkop, African Fish Eagle, African Swamphen, Water Thick-

knee, Three-banded Plover, African Jacana, Whiskered Tern, and Intermediate and Little Egrets. We also managed to add Shelley's, Crested and Hildebrandt's Francolins, Yellownecked Spurfowl, Secretarybird, Bateleur, Whitebellied Bustard, Black-faced Sandgrouse, Ringnecked and Mourning Collared Doves, Barefaced Go-away-bird, Grey Kestrel, Rosy-patched Bushshrike, Black-crowned Tchagra, Fischer's Sparrow-Lark, Northern Pied Babbler, Rufousnaped Lark, Mosque Swallow, Northern Redbilled Hornbill, Greater Blue-eared Starling, White-browed Scrub Robin, Beautiful Sunbird, Chestnut Weaver, Red-billed Quelea, Common

Waxbill and Pin-tailed Whydah, despite variable weather conditions. As the heat increased, so did the number of insects and, with that combination in mind, we decided to slowly make our return to camp. Suddenly, we were brought to screeching halt as a young Leopard quickly climbed down a roadside

tree in which it had been sleeping, allowing us brief but satisfactory views of this fantastic cat. Just when we thought things couldn't get any better, we happened upon a trio of Lionesses sleeping in the long grass. The Lionesses, however, were disturbed by the masses of Tsetse Flies prevalent in the area that were biting everything that moved, and as a result, these large cats were very active as they attempted to find comfortable areas where they would not be disturbed. The more common and

regularly overlooked game species were a perfect foil to the large cats, and we were treated to fantastic views of Impala, African Buffalo, Giraffe and Common Warthog; while we also managed to add Diederik Cuckoo, Lilac-breasted Roller, Striped Kingfisher, Brown-crowned Tchagra, Magpie Shrike, Pearl-spotted Owlet, Pygmy Falcon, African Hoopoe, Lesser Striped Swallow, Rattling Cisticola, Northern White-crowned Shrike, Northern Grey-headed Sparrow, Arrow-marked Babbler, White-backed Vulture, Vitelline Masked Weaver, and Martial, Long-crested and Tawny Eagles.

By midday, we were all ready for a siesta and some lunch, so we returned to the lodge where a wonderful spread was laid out for us, and we had fun watching the various behaviours of Ochre Bush Squirrel, Yellow-spotted Hyraxes, industrious Banded Mongooses, secretive Kirk's Dik-dik and the mischievous Vervets.

As temperatures in the mid-afternoon began to cool, we embarked on a walk around the lodge, where we found White-headed Barbet, Black-backed Puffback, Slate-colored Boubou, Fork-tailed Drongo, Red-faced Crombec, Tawny-flanked Prinia, Grey-backed Camaroptera, Grey-headed Kingfisher, Red-winged Starling, Scarlet-chested Sunbird, Superb Starling, Red-headed Weaver and Red-cheeked Cordon-bleu before we headed out, once again, for bumble near our lodge. We encountered the Lionesses once again, now hiding in the canopy of the small Acacia tree to avoid being bitten by the

Tsetse Flies. We also found a second well-concealed male Leopard sleeping peacefully in a tree near a riverbed, and many Common Dwarf Mongooses. A few new birds included Blackwinged Kite, White-browed Coucal, Speckled Mousebird, D'Arnaud's and Red-and-yellow Barbets, White-bellied Go-away-bird, Red-bellied Parrot, Long-tailed Fiscal, Barn Swallow, Zitting Cisticola, Red-billed Oxpecker, Rufous-tailed Weaver and the magnificent Verreaux's Eagle-Owl. We then returned to the lodge to enjoy another wonderful dinner and retire to our comfortable rooms for a good night's rest.

Our final morning in Tarangire National Park dawned with overcast skies and intermittent drizzle. After a hearty breakfast we departed the lodge, locating an incredible flock of Southern Ground Hornbill still roosting in a tree as we headed for the main gate, only to be interrupted on our journey by a pride of eleven Lions, all of whom were sleeping on the road. We enjoyed fantastic views of the pride

for about half an hour before finally managing to pass these magnificent cats as they melted into the immediate surrounds. The rest of the journey was characterised by small, sharp stops which produced some fantastic bird species, including Common Ostrich, White-bellied Go-away-bird, Northern White-

crowned Shrike, Lilac-breasted Roller, African Hoopoe, Magpie Shrike, Helmeted Guineafowl, Red-necked Spurfowl, Hadada Ibis, Western Cattle Egret, Bateleur, Tawny Eagle, Double-banded Courser, Black-faced Sandgrouse, Ring-necked Dove, Woodland Kingfisher, Cardinal Woodpecker, Black-backed Puffback, Slate-colored Boubou, Fork-tailed Drongo, Fischer's Sparrow-Lark, Eastern Olivaceous Warbler, Rattling Cisticola, Buff-bellied Warbler, Yellow-breasted Apalis, Grey-backed Camaroptera, Northern Pied Babbler, Shelley's Starling, Vitelline Masked Weaver, Red-billed Quelea and White-winged Widowbird.

A river nearby also provided excellent viewing, as we connected with Yellow-billed Stork, Saddle-billed Stork, Great White Pelican, Knob-billed Duck and White-rumped Swift. We also managed a few better views of a number of mammals, including an African Elephant bull, Ochre Bush Squirrel, Banded Mongoose, Waterbuck, Kirk's Dik-dik, and Giraffe. Arriving at the main gate, we spent a short time locating a few more common species: Superb Starling, Grey-headed Kingfisher, Northern Red-billed Hornbill, Bare-faced Go-away-bird, Eastern Grey Woodpecker, Brubru, Red-faced Crombec, Northern Grey-headed Sparrow, Speckle-fronted Weaver and Beautiful Sunbird. Final looks at the abundant Ashy Starlings and Yellow-collared Lovebirds were also enjoyed. With the excitement of the morning over, we departed Tarangire and made our way towards our lunch stop above Lake Manyara, collecting a large breeding colony of Marabou Stork, Black-headed Heron, Brown Snake Eagle, Yellow-billed Kite, Crowned Lapwing, Speckled Pigeon, Pied Crow, Eastern Violet-backed Sunbird, Lesser Masked Weaver, Straw-tailed Whydah, and Yellow-crowned, Black and Black-winged Red Bishop. Glimpses of Common Wildebeest and Thomson's Gazelle were had along the way, before

enjoying a great leg stretch and indulging in some retail therapy during the break.

The remainder of the day was dedicated to travelling to the Ngorongoro Conservation Area. We arrived at the gate where we were royally entertained by a large troop of Olive Baboon before ascending the crater rim. Sadly, as had become evident as we approached the conservation area, there was very little scenery available because of the heavy cloud cover at this elevation. Despite this fact, we were still able to view another Lioness, a troop of Blue Monkey's and a few extra bird species, including

Hildebrandt's Francolin, Augur Buzzard, African Olive Pigeon, Speckled Mousebird, Little Bee-eater, Silvery-cheeked Hornbill, a hunting Peregrine Falcon, Tropical Boubou, Dark-capped Bulbul, Brown Woodland Warbler, Montane White-eye, White-eyed Slaty Flycatcher, Cape Robin-Chat, African

Stonechat, Eastern Double-collared Sunbird, and Thick-billed and Streaky Seedeaters, before we arrived at our accommodation which was positioned to overlook the crater floor on clear days. Having spent much of the day on the road, we took the time to freshen up before enjoying a fantastic dinner and another good night's rest.

Early the next morning, we awoke to severe rainfall. Expecting the worst, we arrived at breakfast, where overcast conditions greeted us, but thankfully the rain had ceased. We departed a short while later to descend to the crater floor of this UNESCO World Heritage Site, passing through a variety of habitats which allowed us to add Augur Buzzard, African Hoopoe, White-eyed Slaty Flycatcher, African Dusky Flycatcher, African Stonechat, Speke's Weaver, and Eastern Double-collared, Bronzy and Golden-winged Sunbirds to our lists during an adventurous ride. It was apparent, as we arrived on the crater floor, that the severe rainfall had flooded large sections

of this inactive, unfilled and intact volcanic caldera, and one may be mistaken for believing that we were driving through a large lake in some sections. Despite this, the clouds slowly parted to provide incredible vistas; while we were also able to locate some fantastic mammals, including African Elephant, Olive Baboon, a mating pair of Lion, Spotted Hyaena, Black Rhinoceros, Hippopotamus, Impala, Thomson's and Grant's Gazelles, Waterbuck, Common Eland, masses of Plains Zebra and Common Wildebeest. The birdlife was no less spectacular, as we managed to see such specials as Common Ostrich, Spur-winged and Egyptian Geese, Yellow-billed Duck, Cape and Red-billed Teals, Helmeted Guineafowl, Yellow-billed Stork, Saddle-billed Stork, African Sacred Ibis, African Spoonbill, Grey Heron, Black-headed Heron, Little Egret, Hamerkop, Great White Pelican, Black-winged Stilt, Common Moorhen, Grey-headed Gull, Whiskered and White-winged Terns, Secretarybird, Bateleur, African Fish Eagle, Kori Bustard, Black-bellied Bustard, Grey Crowned Crane, Blacksmith and Crowned Lapwings, Kittlitz's Plover, Dusky Turtle and Mourning Collared Doves, White-browed Coucal, Speckled Mousebird, Southern Fiscal, Fischer's Sparrow-Lark, Lesser Striped Swallow, Croaking, Zitting and Pectoral-patch Cisticolas, Anteater Chat, Capped Wheatear,

Quailfinch, Pin-tailed Whydah, Fan-tailed and Jackson's Widowbirds, Yellow-throated and Rosy-throated Longclaws, African Pipit, and Rufous-naped and Red-capped Larks. A visit to the local Fever Tree woodland away from the open plains of the caldera allowed us to get good views of Lilac-breasted Roller, Little Bee-eater, Eastern Grey Woodpecker, Dark-capped Bulbul, Orange-breasted Bushshrike, Shelley's Starling and Holub's Golden Weaver before we stopped for lunch, where the resident Yellow-billed Kite, Rufous-tailed Weaver and Superb Starlings attempted to pilfer from the many groups of tourists enjoying a midday meal.

Once we completed lunch, we decided it was time to head back up the crater rim. On our ascent, we managed to see White-backed Vulture, Red-fronted Tinkerbird, Lynes's Cisticola, Brown Parisoma, Yellow Bishop, Purple Grenadier, Southern Citril and a mixed flock of Yellow-billed and Red-billed Oxpeckers servicing a herd of African Buffalo. The montane forest along the crater rim allowed us to add Bar-throated and Brown-headed Apalises, Grey-capped Warbler, Baglafecht Weaver, Grey-headed Nigrita, and Thick-billed and Streaky Seedeaters to our growing list before we returned to camp. With daylight still available, we took a short walk around the gardens of the camp, where we managed to add

Speckled Pigeon, Cardinal Woodpecker, Tropical Boubou, Rock Martin, Hunter's Cisticola, Montane White-eye, African Thrush, Cape Robin-Chat, and Mountain and Sombre Greenbul. We also managed fantastic views of one of our target species, Brown-backed Woodpecker, and a few smaller mammals, including Southern Tree Hyrax and Blue Monkey, before retiring to rooms or, for some, onto the lodge balcony to take in the amazing view as the sun set over the crater. A short while later, we enjoyed a lovely dinner before settling into our comfortable rooms for our final night in the Ngorongoro Crater.

After breakfast on our final morning on the crater rim, we departed in weather conditions which were reminiscent of those we had experienced on our arrival. Yet, despite the difficulty with the weather, we still managed a few species, including Hildebrandt's Francolin, Long-crested Eagle, Schalow's Turaco, Speckled Mousebird, African Hoopoe, Mountain Yellow Warbler, Streaky Seedeater, and Bronzy and Eastern Double-collared Sunbirds, before pushing on toward the Serengeti National Park. As we descended the rim of the crater, we could see flashes of pink from a distance along the edge of a large dam. A short while later, we excitedly obtained excellent views of Greater Flamingo, Egyptian Goose, African Black Duck, Cape Teal, Black-winged Stilt, Blacksmith Lapwing, African Stonechat, Red-collared Widowbird and Mourning Wheatear. We pushed on steadily, arriving at a traditional Masai village a short while later – where we got a brief insight into their pastoral life. At Oldupai Gorge, we enjoyed an educational talk about the origin of early man in Eastern Africa. We then enjoyed a field lunch, where an impromptu birding session produced Namaqua Dove, House and Swahili Sparrows,

Little Swift, Chinspot Batis, Slate-colored Boubou, Rock Martin, Lesser Striped Swallow, Grey-backed Camaroptera, African Yellow White-eye, White-browed Scrub Robin, Rufoustailed and Baglafecht Weavers, Pin-tailed and Straw-tailed Whydahs, Yellow-fronted Canary, Southern Grosbeak-Canary, Variable, Scarletchested and Hunter's Sunbirds — with the latter showing off his diagnostic purple shoulder patches — to complement our good meal.

With a fair distance to cover to get to the lodge, we departed Oldupai Gorge and made our way to the Serengeti National Park border. As we arrived in the Serengeti, we were treated to views of many birds including Helmeted Guineafowl, Marabou Stork, Bateleur, Tawny Eagle, Eastern Chanting Goshawk, Greater Kestrel, Vitelline Masked Weaver, Magpie Shrike, Red-capped Lark, Capped Wheatear, Mourning Collared and Ring-necked

Doves, and White-backed, Rüppell's and Lappet-faced Vultures. The mammals were as spectacular, and we managed to record Spotted Hyaena, Vervet, Plains Zebra, Impala, Hartebeest (known locally as Coke's Hartebeest of the subspecies *cokii*), Common Wildebeest, Grant's Gazelle, Thomson's Gazelle and Giraffe. The highlight of the day was undoubtedly a fantastic female Cheetah who walked directly to our car before crossing the road behind us with little disturbance from other vehicles.

A short stop allowed us to bird a small granitic outcrop at the gate to the Serengeti National

Park, where we managed to add Black-winged Kite, Speckled Pigeon, Rüppell's Starling, Lilac-breasted Roller, Black-lored Babbler, Hildebrandt's Starling, Beautiful Sunbird, Speckle-fronted Weaver, Black-cheeked Waxbill, Yellow-crowned Canary and Fan-tailed Widowbird. After making our way into the park, we were able to connect with many species, including Grey-breasted Spurfowl, Secretarybird, Kori, White-bellied and Black-bellied Bustards, Double-banded Courser, Spotted Thick-knee, Crowned Lapwing, Silverbird, Little Bee-eater, Grey-backed Fiscal, Rattling Cisticola, Rufous-naped Lark, White-headed Buffalo Weaver, Yellow-throated Longclaw, and Superb and Shelley's Starlings. We were also being treated to wonderful views of a large herd of African Elephants and a solitary male Leopard sleeping in a tree before arriving at camp in the late afternoon. We once again enjoyed each other's company that evening; while a fantastic dinner spread was much appreciated before settling for the night in anticipation of a fantastic day ahead.

Following an early morning breakfast, we set out to explore the Serengeti National Park, with focus on locating the tail-end of the annual migration as well as locating as many new bird species as possible. The broad grassland plains contained many species: Common Ostrich, Egyptian Goose, Cape Teal, White Stork, Blackheaded Heron, Secretarybird, Coqui Francolin, Bateleur, Tawny Eagle, Eastern Chanting Goshawk, African Fish Eagle, Kori Bustard, Spotted Thick-knee, Crowned Lapwing, Three-banded Courser, Fan-tailed Widowbird, Magpie Shrike, Black Coucal, Pearl-spotted Owlet, Von der Decken's Hornbill, Pygmy Falcon, Grey-

backed Fiscal, Yellow-breasted Apalis, Zitting Cisticola, White-tailed Lark, Wattled Starling, African Grey Flycatcher, Yellow-spotted Petronia, Red-billed Buffalo Weaver, Rosy-throated Longclaw, and Lilac-breasted and European Roller proved fantastic distractions while we scoured the park in search of the enormous herds which have made this UNESCO World Heritage Site famous. We finally located the unmistakable masses of Plains Zebra and Common Wildebeest covering a large area; while a

carcass attracted Spotted Hyaena, Marabou Stork, and White-backed, Rüppell's and Lappet-faced Vultures, providing excellent views. Rock Hyrax, Giraffe, African Elephant, Banded Mongoose, Vervet, Olive Baboon, Hippopotamus, Common Warthog, Topi, Kirk's Dik-dik, Waterbuck (specifically the subspecies known as *defassa*), Impala, African Buffalo, Klipspringer, Bohor Reedbuck, Bushbuck and our first Nile Crocodile were also seen here. Having covered a large area to locate the herds, we began the long drive back to camp, which allowed us to get views of Three-banded

Plover, Black-faced Sandgrouse, Grey-breasted Spurfowl. Helmeted Guineafowl, Speckled Pigeon, Mourning Collared Dove, Fork-tailed Drongo, Little Bee-eater, Double-banded Courser, Chinspot Batis, Northern Grey-headed Northern White-crowned Shrike, Sparrow, Abyssinian Scimitarbill, Tanzanian Red-billed and African Grey Hornbills, Black-lored Babbler, Rattling Cisticola, African Pipit, Hildebrandt's Starling, and Eastern Grey, Nubian and Bearded Woodpeckers before we arrived back at camp for a late lunch and a short siesta, during which we located Familiar Chat.

With only a small amount of time available in the afternoon, we took a relaxed drive around the immediate vicinity of the lodge, with comical attempts to avoid Tsetse Flies involving extreme speed in opening and closing windows. We located Striated Heron, Superb Starling, Brown Snake Eagle, Blacksmith Lapwing, Three-banded Plover, Rüppell's Starling, Ring-necked Dove, Red-necked Spurfowl, Fischer's Sparrow-Lark, Rufous-naped Lark, Scarlet-chested Sunbird, White-bellied Bustard, White-browed Coucal, D'Arnaud's Barbet, Greater Kestrel, Hooded and White-headed Vultures and a small pride of Lion before we returned to camp for dinner, a view of a Northern Lesser Galago and an excellent night's rest on the back of a fantastic day.

Once again, an early morning breakfast awaited us, before we made our way back into the park to explore. Our morning started with a bang, as we located a pride of Lion with young cubs a short while after departing the lodge. We also had the peculiar site of a mating pair of Black-backed Jackal. We then made our way into an area of Thorn *Acacia*, locating Whistling Helmeted Guineafowl, Grey-crested Helmetshrike, Blacklored Babbler, Blue-capped Cordon-bleu, Yellow-breasted Apalis, Coqui Francolin, Barefaced Go-away-bird, Spot-flanked Barbet, Fantailed Widowbird. Double-banded Courser. Blacksmith, White-bellied Bustard, Crowned and

Spur-winged Lapwings, Martial Eagle, White-backed and Lappet-faced Vultures, Bateleur, Lizard Buzzard, Rock Martin, Mourning Collared Dove, Great Spotted Cuckoo, Little Bee-eater, D'Arnaud's Barbet, Cardinal Woodpecker, Pygmy Falcon, Ashy Flycatcher, Kenya Sparrow, White-headed Buffalo Weaver, Purple Grenadier, Black-faced Waxbill, and Little and White-rumped Swift as we went, but sadly the Karamoja Apalis remained elusive. Black-headed Gonolek, Flappet Lark, Grey-capped Social

Weaver, Speckle-fronted Weaver, Steel-blue Whydah, Reichenow's Seedeater, Yellow-fronted Canary, Southern Grosbeak-Canary, and Northern Grey-headed and Swahili Sparrows acted as replacements. We also managed to locate Spotted Hyaena, Common Warthog, Common Dwarf Mongoose, Plains Zebra, Topi, African Buffalo, Yellow-spotted and Rock Hyraxes and yet another Leopard in a tree before we returned to camp for a delicious lunch.

Our afternoon session saw us stroll through the gardens, recording Green Wood Hoopoe, Von der Decken's Hornbill, Chinspot Batis, Darkcapped Bulbul, Scarlet-chested Sunbird, Holub's Golden Weaver and Yellow-winged Bat before heading off to a local wetland, where we located Greater and Lesser Flamingos, Egyptian Goose, Cape Teal, Grey Heron, Great White Pelican, Black-winged Stilt, Pied Avocet, Three-banded Plover, Common Greenshank, Brown-throated White-winged Tern, White-browed Martin, Coucal, Magpie Shrike, Meyer's Parrot, Fischer's Lovebird, White-tailed Lark, Black-bellied Bustard, Fork-tailed Drongo, Long-crested Eagle,

Rüppell's Starling, Silverbird, Grey-breasted Spurfowl, Ring-necked Dove, Lilac-breasted Roller, African Hoopoe, Lesser Striped Swallow, Red-billed Oxpecker, African Grey Flycatcher, Yellow-throated Longclaw and African Pipit while exploring the area. Our explorations also turned up a host of mammals, including African Elephant, Impala, Olive Baboon, Kirk's Dik-dik, Hippopotamus, Waterbuck and Giraffe, before we returned to camp for our final dinner in the Serengeti.

Breakfast overlooking the Serengeti National Park was the perfect way to start the final day of our exploration of Tanzania. With most of the day dedicated to travel back to Arusha, we took our time as we exited the Serengeti, locating Common Guineafowl, Ostrich, Helmeted Meyer's Parrot, Silverbird, Fork-tailed Drongo, Double-banded Courser, Superb Starling, Greybreasted and Red-necked Spurfowls, Bateleur, Cape Crow, Rufous-naped Lark, and Winding, Croaking, Zitting and Desert Cisticolas before we reached the gate, where we had a brief leg stretch while getting excellent views of White-backed, Rüppell's and Lappet-faced Vultures, Tawny

Eagle, Eastern Chanting Goshawk, Dusky Turtle Dove, Lilac-breasted Roller, White-bellied Canary and Banded Parisoma. Outside the park, we were also rewarded with fantastic views of Magpie Shrike, Northern White-crowned Shrike, Yellow-breasted Apalis, Marabou Stork, Kori Bustard, Spotted Thick-knee, Black-winged Lapwing, Speckled Pigeon, Bare-faced Go-away-bird, Black-lored Babbler, White-headed Buffalo Weaver, Pin-tailed Whydah, and Chestnut-bellied and Yellow-throated Sandgrouse. Large herds of Plains Zebra and Common Wildebeest were intermixed with many other species, including Impala, Kirk's Dik-dik, Giraffe, Spotted Hyaena, Black-backed and Golden Jackals, Grant's Gazelle, Hartebeest, Thomson's Gazelle, Common Eland, Olive Baboon, Common Warthog

and Slender Mongoose. The Ngorongoro Crater rim produced a couple of species – Egyptian Goose, Greater Flamingo, Fan-tailed Widowbird, African Sacred Ibis, Augur Buzzard, African Stonechat, Mourning Wheatear, Eastern Double-collared Sunbird and Red-collared Widowbird among them –

despite the misty conditions through which we travelled, before we exited the Ngorongoro Conservation Area and stopped for lunch at the halfway point.

The rest the day was spent on the road back to Arusha, which produced very little in the way of birds; although we still saw Western Cattle Egret, Rock Dove, Pied Crow, Red-billed Quelea and House Sparrow. As a result, we arrived in the late afternoon and began to bird the gardens a short while later to see what we could find. With fantastic sunlight, many birds were active, and we managed to locate Little Grebe, Blackheaded Heron, African Palm Swift, Speckled Mousebird, Giant Kingfisher, White-eared Barbet, Retz's Helmetshrike, African Paradise Flycatcher, Dark-capped Bulbul, Black Sawwing, Grey-backed Camaroptera, Collared and Amethyst Sunbirds, Thick-billed Weaver, and Red-eyed and Tambourine Doves; while also managing to get good views of Blue Monkey, Guereza and Ochre Bush Squirrel before settling down for a lovely dinner on our final night in Tanzania.

The next morning began with a walk around the gardens of our accommodations in Arusha, where the cool conditions aided us

in locating some of the more difficult skulking species. Grey-olive Greenbul and Red-throated Twinspot were highlights; while we also added Hadada Ibis, African Goshawk, African Paradise Flycatcher, Red-winged Starling, Rüppell's Robin-Chat, and Spectacled and Taveta Weaver as we explored the thickets. We then sat to enjoy a leisurely breakfast, with Blue Monkey relaxing in the large trees near the river, before departing Arusha and heading to Namanga, adding Brown-hooded Kingfisher, Brown-breasted Barbet, Trilling Cisticola, Black-crowned Night Heron, Augur Buzzard,

Rock Dove, Horus Swift, Lesser Kestrel, Pied Crow, White-necked Raven, Spotted Palm Thrush, Capped Wheatear, Speke's Weaver, Redbilled Quelea, Village Indigobird, White-bellied Canary and Purple Grenadier as we made our way to the border town.

After some deft negotiations, we managed to bypass the entertaining ladies hawking their wares at the border post, before passing into Kenya, where we bid Moses a fond farewell before joining up with our Kenyan operator, Peter. A short while later, we were bounding down the main road to Amboseli National Park,

where we stopped to bird, locating White-headed Mousebird, Long-tailed Paradise Whydah, Von der Decken's Hornbill, D'Arnaud's Barbet, Pygmy Falcon, Rosy-patched Bushshrike, Northern Fiscal, Lesser Striped Swallow, Rattling and Tiny Cisticolas, Grey Wren-Warbler, Eastern Violet-backed and

Beautiful Sunbirds, Red-billed Buffalo Weaver, White-browed Sparrow-Weaver, Grey-capped Social Weaver and Bare-eyed Thrush.

After our field lunch, we made our final approach to Amboseli National Park, collecting Harlequin Quail, Eastern Chanting Goshawk, Black-faced Sandgrouse, Speckled Pigeon, Mourning Collared Dove, Namagua Dove, Crowned Lapwing, White-bellied Go-away-bird, Cardinal Woodpecker, White-headed Buffalo Weaver, Straw-tailed Whydah, Little Bee-eater, Helmeted Guineafowl, Grey Crowned Crane, Laughing Dove and the fascinating Gerenuk en route, before entering the vast grasslands at the foothills of Mt Kilimanjaro. One may be forgiven, at this juncture, for thinking that we were in the wrong form of transportation, as a boat may have been

more logical considering the heavy rainfall in the region had flooded the park. Yet, we steadily moved through the park past the numerous wetlands and ephemeral pans, adding Common Ostrich, Greater Flamingo, White-faced and Fulvous Whistling Duck, Egyptian Goose, Hottentot and Red-billed Teals, Three-banded Plover, Common Moorhen, Black-winged Stilt, Pied Avocet, Blacksmith and Long-toed Lapwings, Great White Pelican, Greater Painted-snipe, Grey-headed Gull, Grey Heron, Whiskered and White-winged Terns, Yellow-crowned Bishop, Yellow-billed Stork, African Sacred Ibis, Glossy Ibis, Purple Heron, Great Egret, African Fish Eagle, Kori Bustard, Double-banded Courser, Kittlitz's Plover, Little Swift, Slate-colored Boubou, Hildebrandt's Starling, Northern White-crowned Shrike, Fork-tailed Drongo, Ring-necked Dove, Yellow-necked Spurfowl, Chestnut-headed Sparrow-Lark, Pink-breasted Lark, Speckle-fronted Weaver, Vitelline Masked and Chestnut Weavers, Cardinal Quelea, White-winged Widowbird, African Silverbill, and Fischer's and Wattled Starlings. Mammals added included a trio of male Cheetah, a couple of herds of African Elephant, a troop of Yellow Baboon, Unstriped Ground Squirrel, Plains Zebra, Impala, Common Wildebeest, Thomson's Gazelle, African Buffalo and

Giraffe, and a little later a couple of Lionesses capped off a remarkable welcome to Kenya. We settled into our accommodation before enjoying a wonderfully prepared dinner, followed by a restful night.

Our first morning in Amboseli started calmly, with excellent views of Greater and Lesser Flamingos, Grey Heron, Saddle-billed Stork, Hadada Ibis, Great White Pelican, Three-banded Plover and White-rumped Swift before we encountered two Lionesses which, after a short period of watching, called out two sets of very young cubs from their hiding spot. We continued

into the park, visiting a large wetland which produced White-faced and Fulvous Whistling Ducks, Cape Teal, Black Crake, African Jacana, Common Greenshank, Collared Pratincole, Brown-throated Martin, Spur-winged Lapwing, Malachite, Pied and Grey-headed Kingfishers, Winding Cisticola, African Sacred Ibis, Little Egret, Grey Crowned Crane, Crowned Lapwing, Martial Eagle, Kori Bustard and

White-bellied Bustard. We also got good views of a few of the more common species, including African Fish Eagle, White-backed Vulture, Red-billed Oxpecker, Northern Grey-headed Sparrow, Helmeted Guineafowl, Yellow-necked Spurfowl, Red-billed Firefinch, Laughing Dove, African Grey Flycatcher, Pin-tailed Whydah, Kittlitz's Plover, Long-tailed Fiscal, Red-rumped Swallow, African

Pipit and Fischer's Sparrow-Lark. With the temperature increasing, we had hopes that the cloud covering Kilimanjaro would break, but it stubbornly refused. We returned to camp for lunch and in the stifling heat managed to locate Chestnut-banded Plover, Abyssinian Scimitarbill and Pangani Longclaw before settling into our rooms for a siesta with the company of Vervet and Yellow Baboon.

The afternoon session gave us the leisure to explore another region of the park, and we managed to add Common Ostrich, Taveta Weaver, Yellow-crowned Bishop, African

Spoonbill, and Goliath and Black-headed Herons. We also managed distant views of a few more Lionesses and a wonderful view of a herd of African Elephant, Common Warthog, Hippopotamus, Waterbuck and Grant's Gazelle. Views of Lappet-faced Vulture, Chestnut-bellied Sandgrouse, White-browed Sparrow-Weaver, Red-capped Lark and Lilac-breasted Roller were also enjoyed before we returned to camp for dinner on a fantastic evening.

An early breakfast was the order of the day as we departed Amboseli; and despite clear skies overnight, we experienced cloudy conditions with drizzle as we departed. It wasn't all bad news, as we managed to locate our one and only adult male Lion on the trip, lounging in an open patch of grassland while being harassed by a Side-striped Jackal. Also added were Yellow-necked Spurfowl, Superb Starling, Pin-tailed Whydah, Augur Buzzard, Greater Kestrel, Spotted Palm Thrush, Capped Wheatear, African Pipit, White-bellied Go-away-bird, Jacobin Cuckoo, and Laughing and Ring-necked Doves. On arrival

at the Amboseli gate, we managed to locate a pair of Spotted Eagle-Owls; while also managing views of Golden Pipit, Bearded Woodpecker, Helmeted Guineafowl and Buff-crested Bustard as we exited the park. After a lengthy stretch of road and some extreme traffic, we managed a good leg stretch and a spot of birding, which delivered Western Cattle Egret, Black-headed Heron, Black Kite, Little Swift, Purple Roller, White-headed Barbet, Violet-backed Starling, Lesser Honeyguide, Rock Dove, House Sparrow, Yellow Bishop, Western Citril, Variable Sunbird, and Cape and Pied Crows on the outskirts of Nairobi before we stopped for lunch.

Our hunger sated, and with Mt Kenya National Park within a short distance, we took our time birding many of the wetlands, managing to see Thick-billed Weaver before we entered. Upon entry, we added Hartlaub's Turaco, African Dusky Flycatcher, African Olive Pigeon, Speckled Mousebird, Cinnamon-

chested Bee-eater, Dark-capped Bulbul, Black Saw-wing, Grey Apalis, Northern and Eastern Double-collared Sunbirds, Brown-capped Weaver, Grey-headed Nigrita, Streaky Seedeater and Abbott's Starling. On our way to the lodge, we also added Slender Mongoose and secretive Suni. We arrived at our quaint and well-appointed lodge in the late afternoon, allowing us time to enjoy the view over the

waterhole in front of the lodge, where a few Egyptian Geese and a herd of African Buffalo spent their time trudging through the mud; while a herd of Waterbuck slept on the short surrounding grasses. We settled for an excellent dinner followed by an excellent night's rest.

The next morning, we set about exploring Mt Kenya National Park – a UNESCO World Heritage Site – on foot with a fantastic local guide. Our luck and our guide's expertise combined fantastically to produce many fantastic species: Hartlaub's Turaco, Hadada Ibis, African Goshawk, African Olive Pigeon, African

Emerald Cuckoo, White-headed Wood Hoopoe, White-eared Barbet, Moustached and Yellow-rumped Tinkerbirds, Tullberg's Woodpecker, Grey and Purple-throated Cuckooshrikes, Chinspot Batis, Mountain Oriole, African Paradise Flycatcher, Mountain, Placid and Slender-billed Greenbuls, Chestnut-throated Apalis, Grey-capped Warbler, Grey-backed Camaroptera, African Hill Babbler, Montane White-eye, Brown-chested Alethe, White-starred Robin, and Crowned and Silvery-cheeked Hornbills. Red-legged Sun Squirrel, Ochre Bush Squirrel, Blue Monkey and Guereza passed overhead before a surprise coffee in the middle of the forest made the experience even better. We returned to a good lunch later that afternoon, before enjoying a good break disturbed only by a juvenile Martial Eagle, Baglafecht Weaver, Cape Wagtail, Yellow-crowned Canary and Speckled Mousebird. Bushbuck fed around the waterhole fringes.

We took a drive through the reserve in the afternoon, which proved to be pretty quiet, despite efforts to find a few species. We still managed to locate a few fantastic species, including Hamerkop, Crowned

Eagle, Brown Woodland Warbler, Ring-necked Dove, Tropical Boubou, Southern Fiscal, Rock Martin, Cinnamon Bracken Warbler, Hunter's Cisticola, Kenrick's Starling, Abyssinian Thrush, White-eyed Slaty Flycatcher, Cape and Rüppell's Robin-Chats, Collared Sunbird, Yellow-bellied Waxbill, Pin-tailed Whydah, Thick-billed Seedeater and wonderful views of Red-fronted Parrot, before we returned to camp for dinner having enjoyed a breathtaking day in this incredible area.

The next morning, we departed the lodge with a short drive ahead, allowing us to add the

ridiculous Long-tailed Widowbird, African Paradise Flycatcher, African Sacred Ibis, Western Cattle Egret, Grey and Black-headed Herons, Blacksmith Lapwing, Boran Cisticola, Holub's Golden and Speke's Weavers, Bronzy Sunbird and a stunning pair of Little Rock Thrush as we made our way to the

Shaba Nature Reserve – the setting for the book Born Free, and once home to conservationists George and Joy Adamson. Set in an arid Savannah mixed with lava flows, dramatic scenery and dry grassland, it wasn't long before we were adding some spectacular new species to our lists, including the funky Bristle-crowned Starling, Somali Courser, Northern Crombec, Somali and White-throated Bee-eaters, and some less so – the dull Brown-tailed Rock Chat a prime example – before we arrived at our camp

for lunch with a fantastic Nile Crocodile and Nile Monitor for company.

After a short siesta through the heat of the day, we headed out for a short drive, locating African Palm and Little Swifts, Red-bellied Parrot, Helmeted Guineafowl, White-headed Buffalo Weaver, Black-capped Social Weaver, Hadada Ibis, Laughing Dove, Hooded Vulture, Buffcrested Bustard, Black-faced Sandgrouse, Spurwinged and Crowned Lapwings, Ring-necked Dove, Emerald-spotted Wood Dove, Fischer's, Red-winged and Superb Starlings, White-bellied Go-away-bird, Lilac-breasted Roller, Little Bee-

eater, Black-throated Barbet, Brubru, Fork-tailed Drongo, White-browed Scrub Robin, African Grey Flycatcher, Northern White-crowned Shrike, Parrot-billed Sparrow, Yellow-spotted Petronia, Chestnutheaded Sparrow-Lark, Eastern Violet-backed and Scarlet-chested Sunbirds, Dark-capped Bulbul, Redfronted Warbler, White-browed Sparrow-Weaver, and Northern Red-billed, Von der Decken's and Eastern Yellow-billed Hornbills. Wonderful views of Grevy's Zebra and Gerenuk were had. A nearby storm produced a magnificent canvas for some spectacular scenic views, too. We returned to camp later that evening to enjoy a delicious dinner and a wonderful sleep, with the roaring sound of the full flowing Uaso Nyiro River in our ears.

An early start followed the next morning, as we set out after breakfast to try to locate Williams's Lark. Along the way, we added Vulturine Guineafowl, Bateleur, Ovambo Sparrowhawk, Three-banded Plover, Bearded and Cardinal Woodpeckers, Grey Wren-Warbler, Spotted Palm Thrush, Beautiful Sunbird, Speckle-fronted and Red-headed Weavers and a pair of Yellow-vented Eremomela. However,

on arrival at the site, we found the grass was overgrown; and despite trying, only I managed a brief glimpse of a Williams's Lark. Consolations Chestnut-backed Sparrow-Lark Friedmann's Lark. Despite the minor setback, we still managed fantastic views of Guenther's Dikdik, Giraffe (known as the Reticulated Giraffe of subspecies reticulata) and Gerenuk. We returned to camp for lunch and a short walk, which produced Lesser Honeyguide, Red-eyed Dove and Red-fronted Tinkerbird, followed by our departure to Buffalo Springs.

Our extensive travel in the afternoon meant we were subjected to a thirty-minute drive to our next lodge, during which we gained some spectacular views of Beisa Oryx, Grevy's Zebra, Giraffe, Black-backed Jackal, and Desert Warthog before we arrived at camp in the searing midday heat. We took the opportunity to enjoy a short siesta before heading out to explore the wonderful woodland with interspersed grassland and palm savanna, which produced Crested Francolin, Tawny Eagle, Gabar Goshawk, Eastern Chanting Goshawk, Pygmy Falcon, Kori Bustard, Chestnut-bellied Sandgrouse, White-bellied Go-away-bird, Grey-headed Kingfisher, Grant's Wood Hoopoe, Nubian Woodpecker, Rosy-patched Bushshrike, Brubru, Singing

Bush Lark, Northern Crombec, Fork-tailed Drongo, Red-billed and White-headed Buffalo Weavers, Blue-naped Mousebird, Pink-breasted Lark, Northern Black Flycatcher, and White-browed and Donaldson Smith's Sparrow-Weavers before we returned for dinner at our lodge.

The next morning, after a hearty breakfast in the company of a Rufous Chatterer, we headed into the Samburu Game Reserve via Buffalo Springs in search of some new species in the arider *Commiphora*-based habitats. En route we managed to add Somali Ostrich, Yellow-necked

Spurfowl, Western Cattle Egret, Secretarybird, Eastern Chanting Goshawk, Wattled Starling, Kori Bustard, Northern Crombec and a scintillating flock of Golden-breasted Starling. A vast array of excellent species within the Samburu ecosystem included Vulturine Guineafowl, Von der Decken's and Eastern Yellow-billed Hornbills, Crested Francolin, Bateleur, a stunning adult Martial Eagle, Buffcrested Bustard, Diederik Cuckoo, Lilac-breasted Roller, Black-throated Barbet, Eastern Grey Woodpecker, Pygmy Falcon, Pygmy Batis, Northern Puffback, Taita Fiscal, Fan-tailed Raven, Acacia Tit, White-tailed Lark, Dodson's Bulbul, Northern Brownbul, Hunter's Sunbird, Cut-throat Finch, Red-billed Firefinch, Blue-capped Cordon-bleu, Somali Bunting and White-headed Mousebird. Some of the

smaller mammals provided the entertainment before we returned to camp for a quick lunch.

During our midday siesta, we managed to view Speckled Pigeon, White-bellied Canary and Marico Sunbird. A Black-bellied Sunbird was observed coming to the garden sprinkler system, which was a fantastic distraction before our afternoon activity. Having had such a successful session of birding in the morning, we could scarcely believe the evening could produce much more; yet the evening drive still produced Rosypatched Bushshrike, Namaqua Dove, Pearlspotted Owlet, Northern White-crowned Shrike,

White-throated Bee-eater, D'Arnaud's Barbet, Black-capped Social Weaver, Vitelline Masked Weaver, and Black-faced and Lichtenstein's Sandgrouse before we returned to our lodgings for our final night in Buffalo Springs.

Our final morning in Buffalo Springs involved another enjoyable breakfast, followed by an impromptu walk which produced Pied Kingfisher, Slate-colored Boubou, Shining Sunbird, Golden Palm Weaver and Village Weaver before we departed for Lake Nakuru. The drive out of the reserve still produced

some excitement when we came upon a Zebra carcass being devoured by a host of vultures, including White-backed, Lappet-faced and Rüppell's, before we drove through the Zebra print gate and headed onward to our lunch spot, stopping occasionally to add Yellow-billed Duck, Black-headed Heron, Grey

Crowned Crane, Red-collared Widowbird, Brimstone Canary, Common Moorhen, Red-knobbed Coot, and Barn and Wire-tailed Swallows. Sadly, we missed a Cape Eagle-Owl which was at a roost on a private property and therefore inaccessible.

After lunch we pushed on to Lake Nakuru, a RAMSAR site. Once home to a vast number of flamingos, the alarming increase in water levels has resulted in much lower numbers of flamingo; but we were happy to find White-breasted Cormorant, African Darter, Black-winged Kite, Augur Buzzard, Red-eyed Dove, Red-capped

Lark, African and Plain-backed Pipits, White-fronted Bee-eater, Green Wood Hoopoe, Fischer's Lovebird, Chinspot Batis, Brown-crowned Tchagra, Red-faced Crombec, Singing Cisticola, Tawny-flanked Prinia, Western Citril, Greater Blue-eared Starling, Violet-backed Starling, Bare-eyed Thrush, Anteater Chat, Grey-backed Fiscal, Black-headed Oriole, White-bellied Tit, Jackson's Widowbird, Yellow-throated Longclaw and Blue-spotted Wood Dove on arrival. We were also fortunate to watch a Common Impala give birth to a new foal at some distance when we arrived. We also managed views of Guereza and Olive Baboon before we headed into our lodge as a storm threatened nearby. Once settled in, and with the storm seemingly past, we tried our luck birding the garden but turned up very few species as the storm threat kept most species safely concealed. We convened later that evening for our final tour dinner while being serenaded by a lone guitarist as we enjoyed a fantastic spread.

An early morning breakfast kickstarted our final morning on tour, as we headed out into Lake Nakuru to add as many species as we could. The morning started fantastically with Eurasian Hoopoe, a pair of Lanner Falcon, Greater and Lesser Flamingos, Great White and Pink-backed Pelicans, Reed Cormorant, and Brown Snake, Long-crested and Martial Eagles. We also managed a single Spotted Hyaena and several White Rhinoceros mingled with some fantastic birds, including Cape Teal, Hildebrandt's Francolin, African Spoonbill, Hamerkop, a large flock of Grey Crowned Crane, Grey-headed Gull, and Whiskered and White-winged Terns.

Masses of African Buffalo were prevalent throughout the park; while we also managed to add Klaas's and Black Cuckoos, Broad-billed Roller, African Grey Hornbill, Greater Honeyguide, Grey-headed Bushshrike, Hunter's Cisticola, Rüppell's and Superb Starlings, White-browed Robin-Chat, Yellow Bishop, Long-tailed Widowbird, Red-cheeked Cordon-bleu, Common Waxbill, Mosque Swallow, and Common and African Black Swifts as we explored the furthest reaches of the reserve, before finally returning to the Lake Nakuru Gate where we got scintillating views of a Red-fronted Tinkerbird before

departing the reserve en route to Nairobi. A short while later, we enjoyed our final field lunch before the final leg of the journey.

The final stretch was rather uneventful, from a birding perspective, yet we still had time to add some excitement to the dying moments of the tour as we stopped, searched for and found a pair of Sharpe's Longclaw in a fallow field before making our final approach to Nairobi, also adding African Pied Wagtail. With our seat backs upright, our seat trays stowed and our eagerness to return home setting in, we arrived in Nairobi to complete a fantastic tour. In all, we managed 439 different bird species and 52 mammals during our 18-day adventure.
