Tour Summary

Our tour started at the stunning Ngarasero Lodge, on the outskirts of the bustling city of Arusha. The first bird we saw for the trip was a vocal Verreaux's Eagle-Owl, which was calling from a comfortable

perch in a large tree in the centre of the garden. We then met Moses, who would be our driver and guide whilst we were in Tanzania. After a couple of hours of driving, we finally arrived at the entrance gate leading to Tarangire National Park. We were greeted by a couple of beautiful Yellow-collared Lovebirds, who were nesting in the nearby giant Baobab. We also had close views of a female Nubian Woodpecker probing a few small fallen tree stumps on the ground. Earlier in the day, we got a heads up that the recent heavy rains had made the main road leading to our lodge inaccessible, so we had to take an alternative and longer route. We had many sightings along the way, with some of the highlights including a herd of African Elephants spraying themselves with mud from a puddle in the road. We also had a couple of sightings of Masai Giraffe. As we neared the lodge, we saw the beautiful Yellow-necked Spurfowl and a Black-faced Sandgrouse in the road.

After breakfast we headed back into the park. We headed in the direction of the Silale Swamp, and along the way we saw D'Arnaud's Barbet, Von der Decken's and Northern Red-billed Hornbills, Bateleurs in flight, the huge Southern Ground Hornbill, a Double-banded Courser, and we watched an impressive display from a family of Long-tailed Shrikes as they were swaying their long tails in all directions. At the swamp we saw a good number of birds, such as Fulvous and White-faced Whistling

Ducks, Red-billed and Hottentot Teals, African Openbill, Whiskered and White-winged Terns, African Jacanas, Grey Kestrels, African Swamphen and an Eastern Chanting Goshawk. We found an area where we could get out and stretch our legs, and we managed to get a fantastic look at a male Purple Grenadier scuttling along the ground. We continued back along the swamp again and this time Moses stopped the vehicle and showed us a large male Leopard lying in an Acacia Tree. We then turned the vehicle around and made our way back to the lodge for Lunch.

In the afternoon we took a short drive, and this turned out to be a very productive few hours, getting looks at Dwarf Bittern, Spotted Palm Thrush, Bearded Woodpecker stunning views of Red-and-yellow Barbets, Pangani Longclaw, Slate-colored Boubou and a pair of Bronzewinged Coursers. Throughout the day we had excellent Elephant sightings, and we even managed to see a couple

of Common Warthogs running through the tall grass. The Masai Giraffe posed well for us, and we got to see both Red-billed and Yellow-billed Oxpeckers on the Giraffe too! Just before dinner, we went outside onto the veranda and managed to hear and then see a Freckled Nightjar.

We said goodbye to Tarangire National Park, and on our way out we had excellent views of a pride of Lions, with a Lioness and cubs lying in the road. We also came across a dead Elephant with five species of vultures feeding on it. These were White-backed, Rüppell's, White-headed, Hooded and Lappet-faced. At the exit gate of the National Park, we stopped to have a look for Mottled Spinetails, which we got several views of, as well as looks at White-browed Scrub Robins and the ever-vocal Green Wood Hoopoes. We made our way past Lake Manyara, spotting many Yellow-billed Storks sitting in the Fig Trees overhanging across the road. We passed the town of Karatu next and stopped for lunch before making our way to the Ngorongoro Crater lookout point. It was a clear day, and through our binoculars we could see large herds of African Elephants, African Buffalo and Common Wildebeest. We also saw a couple of birds, such as Mountain White-eye,

Mountain Bulbul, Black Saw-wing and brief views of Schalow's Turaco in a nearby tree. We then took the final drive to the lodge along the crater rim, and here we saw a couple more Schalow's Turacos flying across the road, as well as Hildebrandt's Francolins, Lemon Dove, White-eyed Slaty Flycatcher and a few Streaky Seedeaters. We finally arrived at our beautiful lodge overlooking the Ngorongoro Crater and had a lovely dinner and good night's rest before heading down into the crater the next day.

At breakfast, we were treated to sightings of White-necked Ravens, African Stonechat, Cape Robin-Chat and Streaky Seedeaters on the lawn. After a delicious breakfast, we made our way down into the Ngorongoro Crater, getting good looks at Thick-billed Seedeater, White-eyed Slaty Flycatcher, Dove. African Dusky Dusky Turtle Flycatcher, Purple Grenadier, Tropical Boubou, Stunning Golden-winged the Sunbird and Eastern Double-collared Sunbird. As we neared the bottom of the crater, we drove through some grassland which attracted birds such as Lesser Masked Weavers, Lynes's Cisticola, Red-capped and Rufous-naped Larks, Bronzy Sunbird,

Augur Buzzards and Red-collared Widowbirds. We finally arrived in the crater, getting views of large numbers of African Buffalos, as well as a pride of Lions. We also saw two Black Rhinos in the distance. Even though they were far, we could still see them well through the binoculars. We passed

herds of Plains Zebra and Common Wildebeest and we then started to see larger birds such as Grey Crowned Cranes, African Fish Eagle and the huge Kori Bustard. One of the best views for some of us was a close view of a Rosy-throated Longclaw standing on a termite mound right next to the side of the

road. After lunch we drove through a Fever Tree Forest, getting good looks at Holub's Golden Weaver and a Greater Honeyguide. Towards the latter part of the day, we passed the large lake, getting distant views of Lesser and Greater Flamingos, and we also saw Red-billed, Cape and Hottentot Teals. We stopped at a place called Hippo Pools and here we saw two African Spoonbills, Lesser Swamp Warbler, Malachite Kingfisher and Pectoral-patch Cisticolas. We finally called it a day, making our way back to good views of Black-bellied Bustards and Tacazze Sunbird towards the top.

We woke to a cold, misty and wet morning, and after a welcomed hot breakfast we made our way along the crater rim once again, through the mist and rain. We finally started to descend, arriving at Oldupai Gorge where we had an informative talk

about the archaeology of the area. We also managed to find Southern Grosbeak-Canary, Steel-blue Whydah, Red-fronted Barbet and Cape Batis within a few metres from the vehicle. We then made our way to the Serengeti National Park and once we arrived we were greeted to large amounts of Common Wildebeest, Plains Zebras and two lazy male Lions lying in the grass. We also saw numerous bird species, such as Capped Wheatear, Secretarybird, Black-chested Snake Eagle, Chestnut Sandgrouse, Purple and European Rollers, Black-lored Babblers, Grey-breasted Spurfowl and White-bellied Bustard, before arriving at our beautiful lodge nestled in the lush green Acacia hillside.

Today was our first full day in the Serengeti, and after a good night's rest and a delicious breakfast we made our way through the reserve, heading to the centre. Along the way, we stopped for Waterbuck Coke's looks at and Hartebeest. On the bird side of things, we saw Coqui Francolin, Jacobin Cuckoo, Black-chested Snake Eagle, Brubru, Black-bellied Bustard and a melanistic Gabar Goshawk. We then drove through some tricky sections of road, swatting Tsetse Flies and trying not to get stuck because the continuous amount of rain had totally saturated the park. We finally made it to the area known as Seronera

and here we saw two Lionesses sitting in a Sausage Tree. We then continued to the information centre and here we stopped to do some birding, which ended up being a highly productive stop. We saw Grey-

headed Silverbill, Grey-capped Social Weaver, Blue-capped Cordon-bleu, Little Weaver, Horus Swift, a female Purple Grenadier and an inquisitive family of Usambiro Barbets (Split from D'Arnaud's Barbet).

We then made the journey back to the lodge, getting views of Wood Sandpiper, Martial Eagle and excellent views of the pretty Fisher's Lovebirds. After lunch we headed back out into the park with the loud sound of thunder, and we knew that rain was inevitable. We then got news about a Leopard that was seen earlier in the day, so we tried our luck. We managed to spot a Long-crested Eagle along the way and eventually we came across a tree with a dead Impala in it. There was no leopard present, and after some serious searching we finally spotted the Leopard relaxing in another nearby tree. By this time the rain had arrived, so we headed back along the road which had now become a river, passing a lovely herd of African Elephants enjoying all the new pools.

o The day of the cats! Today we headed back to the central section of Serengeti National Park, hoping to get as far into the north-western side of the park as possible, as there were some different habitats to explore in that area. The weather had not made our lives easier at all, as the rain continued to pour and roads deteriorated quickly, causing many nail-biting off-roading manoeuvres – handled masterfully by

Moses. Near Seronera Airport there was quite a pile-up of vehicles; passing through the traffic jam, we could just make out the heads of a couple of Lionesses sitting in the tall grass. We then drove to the next sighting, where there was a Leopard sleeping in a large tree. We watched this magnificent animal for a while, hoping it would lift its head for the ideal photograph. Finally, it lifted its head which was then partly obscured by a branch.

We returned to the Lion sightings and noticed that the Lions had crossed the road. They were making their way back in the direction we originally came from. So, we decided to get to a section of road where they would cross. Within a couple of minutes, we had three Lionesses appear from the tall grass and then a few minutes later, a huge male Lion walked right next to our vehicle. We stopped for short break at the airport and then we got the news that we had been waiting for: some Cheetahs had been seen and we had a good chance to see them, as we were in the right part of the park.

So, our Ferrari Safari began, as we had a large area to cover and there was still a chance that the Cheetah would have disappeared by the time we got there. We drove through two huge downpours before finally reaching the area. The short grass definitely looked like the most promising Cheetah country we had seen yet. We finally arrived at the sighting, with a mother Cheetah and her two one-year-old cubs sitting in the grass next to the road. We spent a great deal of time with these beautiful animals, and this was by far one of the highlights of the trip, as Cheetah was a new cat for most of the group. We then made our way back through some more rain and stopped where an immature Martial Eagle had just killed a White Stork. We spent some time here watching the eagle plucking the feathers

one by one, and tearing strips of meat from the dead stork. At this point we decided we needed to have lunch too, and made our way back through the mud to the lodge for a late lunch. In the afternoon, we took a short walk around the hotel, picking up a few new bird species such as Whitebrowed Robin-Chat, Spot-flanked Barbet, African Paradise Flycatcher, Beautiful Sunbird, Familiar Chat, Scarlet-chested Sunbird. Pearlspotted Owlet and a Red-fronted Tinkerbird.

We bid farewell to the lovely lodge staff in the Serengeti and made our way back to Arusha. We managed to take a few different roads this time, as the sun was out and the roads had dried up. Again, with Moses's expert driving we managed to get through a few hairier muddy patches. We passed several Black-bellied Bustards and we also saw a very dirty Secretarybird and plenty of Yellow-throated Sandgrouse as we made our way to Naabi Gate. Once we arrived at the gate, all we could see were thousands of animals in the open plains. This was indeed the migration, as all we could see for miles were black dots which were all the Common Wildebeest, alongside large numbers of Plains Zebras and Thomson's Gazelles too. We then made our way back along the Ngorongoro Crater, spotting Augur Buzzards and Dusky Turtle Dove in the mist, and then we made our way down towards Lake Manyara, where we came across a kettle of Yellow-billed Storks and Pink-backed Pelicans. We finally arrived in Arusha and after checking in we took a short walk around the gardens, where we

managed to see White-eared Barbet, the vocal Silvery-cheeked Hornbills, Mountain Wagtail, Little Grebes, Amethyst and Collared Sunbirds, Black-throated Wattle-eye, Black-backed Puffback and excellent looks at the brilliant African Emerald Cuckoo.

We left our beautiful lodge in Arusha for the final time and made our way through the town of Moshi and then on to the Tarakea Border post, where we would leave Tanzania and enter Kenya. We said goodbyes to Moses and met George, our Kenyan guide and driver for the next couple of days. We drove straight to the entrance gate of Amboseli National Park and as we were about to enter the reserve the heavens opened up and it poured so much that we decided to drive straight to the

lodge instead. We finally arrived at our stunning lodge in the Amboseli National Park and after a short break, we headed out with George along a few roads beside some waterlogged areas. We saw plenty of Fulvous Whistling Ducks, Pied Kingfisher, Temminck's and Little Stints, one Madagascar Pond Heron, many Squacco Herons, and Common and Lesser Moorhens. We also had plenty of views of Ruff, and we had a great look at a pair of African Fish Eagles sitting in an Acacia Tree beside the road.

Today we headed out in the hope of finding a few specialities for the area. Our first new bird for the trip was a close look at a Short-tailed Lark, followed by sightings of the very vocal Singing Bush Lark. We also stopped for a

couple of great looks at Chestnut-bellied Sandgrouse and a Spotted Thick-knee sitting close to the road. As we continued the new species appeared, such as Southern Red Bishop, as well as Purple Heron, excellent views of Blue-naped and White-headed Mousebirds, Cardinal and Red-billed Queleas, Taita Fiscals, the electric yellow Golden Pipit, Rosy-patched Bushshrike and a curious Buff-crested Bustard. As we neared the gate, we saw large flocks of Chestnut Sparrows and Chestnut Weavers, and at the gate we managed to see a Common Kestrel in a nest, as well as a Spotted Eagle-Owl in an Acacia Tree next to the road. We then made our way back to the lodge after a very exciting morning of birding. In

the afternoon, we went back out and passed the resident comical troop of Olive Baboons, and we visited some more wetland areas where we saw a huge number of Greater and Lesser Flamingos, as well as Great White Pelicans, Greater and Intermediate Egrets, Black Heron, a pair of Grey Crowned Cranes, with three small brown chicks, and good looks at African Jacanas and Hamerkops. There were also a good number of Hippopotamus feeding in the water, and on the last section we drove we came across Water Thickknees and watched White-winged Terns, in various colour phases, joined by Whiskered as they were diving into the water next to the road.

Today we left Amboseli National Park, and just as we were about to exit we managed to see our first group of Fischer's Starlings and had another great look at a Golden Pipit. We then left the park and finally managed to cross the bridge that was recently flooded. Not too far after this, we found our first Brown Snake Eagle sitting on a pole. We then started our long

journey towards Nairobi, using the many bypasses to get on the road that would us to Mt Kenya. Our lunch stop was at a small Del Monte store opposite large pineapple plantations. Not long after our lunch stop, we stopped again to look for Hinde's Babbler. We enjoyed Bronzy Sunbird, Northern


Fiscal, Speckled Mousebird and even Northern Pied Babblers, but no Hinde's Babblers were to be seen or heard. We decided to get back into the vehicle and try a little further along the road, but as we were about to leave we heard the babblers calling. Scrambling back out, we managed to get some decent looks at both colour morphs of this group! After our success we headed to our lodge at Mt Kenya and had a relaxing evening, with views of Bushbuck and Waterbuck at the waterhole in front of the lodge.

We woke up to another wet and cold day. Because of all the rain, we skipped the forest walk and birded from the confines of the lodge instead. Thankfully, the lodge is well-designed for bird and animal viewing, with two viewing decks. From the decks we saw African Olive Pigeon and a female Eastern Bronze-naped Pigeon, as well as White-eyed Slaty Flycatchers, African Black Duck, Black-throated Apalis, Spectacled and Baglafecht Weavers, Yellow-crowned and Kikuyu White-eyes and Cape and African Pied Wagtails. We then took a short walk in the car park, where

we found Black-chested and Grey Apalises, Rüppell's Robin-Chat, African Dusky Flycatcher, Yellow-whiskered Greenbul and had brief glances of a stubborn Cinnamon Bracken Warbler. Another visit to

the viewing decks yielded some Scaly Francolins feeding near Waterbuck. After lunch, we headed back out with George. On this drive we saw a couple of Hartlaub's Turacos, had close views of a group very social Hunter's Cisticola, and enjoyed Moustached Tinkerbird, Crowned Hornbills, the huge Silvery-cheeked Hornbills, Mountain and Slender-billed Greenbuls and a Northern Double-collared Sunbird. After a few more looks at a Hartlaub's Turaco, we made our way back to the lodge, spotting Harvey's Duiker just before.

We woke to the call of a Spotted Hyaena, and also managed to see the resident Verreaux's Eagle-Owl before breakfast. After breakfast, we loaded the vehicle and made our way out of the park. The sun was shining, and things were looking good as we managed to get a few more forest species. Species found included Hartlaub's Turacos, Mountain Greenbuls, brief views of a Barred-tailed Trogon, great looks at White-headed Wood Hoopoes, Montana Orioles, Red-fronted Parrots, Waller's Starlings, and we had a lovely look at a pair of Silvery-cheeked Hornbills sitting in a tree as we left the forest. Along the way to Nanyuki – the town located on the equator – we managed to see a beautiful male Long-tailed Widowbird hovering over the grass, displaying its magnificent tail. Before we knew it, we were almost at our next destination. We took the turnoff to the lodge and just before we reached the gate we managed to see a Brown-tailed

Rock Chat. At the entrance gate, we saw Fan-tailed Raven, Parrot-billed Sparrow and a White-fronted Bee-eater. We then headed straight to the lodge to enjoy a delicious lunch and a short break before heading back out for an afternoon drive. The drive was spectacular; we got to see Abyssinian Scimitarbill, Somali Bee-eater, Black-throated Barbet, Golden-breasted Starling, Chestnut-headed

Sparrowlark, Yellow-spotted Petronia, Eastern Yellow-billed Hornbill and the fascinating Vulturine Guineafowl. We also had some new mammal sightings, such as the stunning Reticulated Giraffe, an unusual encounter with a family of Greater Kudus and the strange looking Gerenuk. One of the highlights of the day was watching a couple of Fork-tailed Drongos chase two Olive Baboons out of a tree.

We left after breakfast today – it was definitely the hottest day we had had on the trip so far, so we were looking forward to a fun and warm morning out. This time around, we managed to get further into the reserve than we had before, and managed to see Black-capped Social Weavers and a pair of very shy Lichtenstein's Sandgrouse. We also managed to get a decent look at a family of Vulturine Guineafowl with a dozen chicks or so, and some better looks at Gerenuk and Reticulated Giraffes. After lunch back at the lodge, we managed to see Red-billed Firefinch and a pair of Black-bellied Sunbirds. We then loaded the vehicle and headed across the road to Buffalo Springs,

getting views of Bristle-crowned and Magpie Starlings on the way. Before reaching the lodge at Buffalo Springs, we had a fantastic look at a Secretarybird along the side of the road. After checking in, enjoying lunch and taking a short break, we headed back into the reserve to manage fantastic looks at Pygmy Falcon, Grevy's Zebra and Beisa Oryx. We also managed to nail a close sighting of Somali Coursers, which fed happily around our vehicle, and got a few brief looks at Vulturine Guineafowl. During our evening checklist, we were entertained by the call of a Slender-tailed Nightjar, which we

eventually managed to see, and also had the privilege of watching the resident Nile Crocodile being fed the left-overs from dinner.

We woke to the perfect morning in Africa, with the sounds of the Spotted Palm Thrush and Slate-colored Boubou calling outside our rooms. During breakfast, we were entertained by numerous birds feeding on the recently fried insects that ventured too close to the spotlight the night before. Species seen included White-throated Beeeaters, Rufous Chatterer and a Black-necked Weaver. We then went out for the game drive in Samburu Reserve. We travelled through some bumpy terrain and got views

of Somali Ostriches, impressive Reticulated Giraffe and a couple of Desert Warthogs. A memorable moment was shared with an inquisitive and large Elephant bull, which came incredibly close to the vehicle to have a look at us before moving off without any issues. We picked up some more good views of Somali Bee-eaters and the large Red-winged Lark, as well as excellent views of Dark-capped Social Weavers and two Three-banded Coursers next to the side of the road. We then headed back

along the rather bumpy and degraded road, caused by recent rains, and made our way back to the lodge for lunch. After lunch and a break, we headed back into the Buffalo Springs Reserve, where we had great views of Beisa Oryx bulls fighting, and we had the best sighting of a family of Vulturine Guineafowls yet.

After another good night's rest, we had a relaxing breakfast. From the restaurant's deck, we saw a pair of Rufous Chatterers, a pair of Slate-colored

Boubous and had a brief glimpse at a Golden Palm Weaver as it flew through the building, past the bar and towards the main parking circle. We then loaded the Land Cruiser and made our way to Lake Nakuru. With clear skies, we were rewarded with stunning views of snow-capped Mt Kenya. During our journey we passed some farmlands, getting views of Jackson's Widowbirds, as well as great looks at Brimstone Canary, Rufous Sparrows, Greater Blue-eared Starling and Red-cheeked Cordon-bleus. We stopped at a small wetland just outside the town of Nyahururu, and saw a couple of Red-knobbed Coots, as well as Grey Crowned Cranes, Little Grebes, Common Moorhen and a few Brown-throated Martins flying over the water. We finally arrived at the entrance gate leading into Lake Nakuru National Park, and it did not take us long to spot our first new bird, Striped Kingfisher. We drove through the reserve, getting great looks at herds of African Buffalo, and we even saw a White

Rhinoceros. We came across a few more Jackson's Widowbirds, which posed well for us, and we saw plenty of Anteater Chats. Making our way to the lodge along the river road, we managed to see a Colobus Monkey (Guereza) feeding in a large Fever Tree. The road also yielded many Red-billed Firefinches, and just before we arrived at our camp a Blue-spotted Wood Dove landed in front of our vehicle.

Today was our final day of the tour, and we had a lengthy drive ahead of us to get to Nairobi to avoid the traffic congestion. After breakfast we took a slow drive around the lake, getting a good look at an African Firefinch feeding on the road. We then continued around the lake, getting a few more highlights, such as Red-faced Crombec, African Darter, White-breasted Cormorant, Common Scimitarbill, Grey Woodpecker, Klaas's and Black Cuckoos, White-fronted Bee-eater, Brubru, Eurasian

Hoopoe and a couple of Augur Buzzards. On the game side of things, we had excellent views of a few White Rhinos, very playful Plains Zebra, Olive Baboons, Black-backed Jackal, African Buffalo and a new subspecies of giraffe, namely Rothschild's. We then left the park and headed in the direction of Nairobi, stopping for brief looks at a pair of uncooperative Sharp's Longclaws. Our final stop was at a wetland, where we saw Red-knobbed Coots, African Swamphen and a pair of Yellow-billed Ducks. The tour ended at the Jomo Kenyatta International Airport, where we all said our goodbyes and went our separate ways.
